new 30-minute documentary following an experimental 'human wolf pack' in the Scottish Highlands has been released by award-winning independent filmmaker <u>Lisa Marley</u>.

The film – which is now available to watch online – examines Project Wolf, a study run by charity <u>Trees for</u> <u>Life</u>. Volunteers spent weeks in the <u>Caladonian Fores</u>, mimicking the behaviours and disturbance patterns of large predators, like wolves. The aim of the project was to curb overgrazing by the native red deer population and protect sagings and new growth.

Lisa (27), originally from Aberdeenshire and now based in Bristol, funded the documentary through a crowdfunding campaign in early 2017, which was supported by BBC star and conservationist Chris Patchham.

Lisa said: "It's been over a year since I launched the crowdfunding campaign for Project Wolf, and since then I have been living and breathing this film. I am so thrilled to finally be able to share it.
